It's been a big year for Scott Berry, culminating with the presentation of the Stantec Artist of the Year Award at the *Here's Nina* event in November. Scott heads to Calgary at the end of the month for the Sparks disability art festival for the 5th and final public exhibition of the installation inspired by his work, *Confusement*. While in Calgary, Scott, with support from Nina's Artistic Director Paul Freeman, will be working individually with artists to critique their work and share insights from his own practice. Based on the tremendous success of this project, Stantec has renewed its commitment. The 2016 Stantec Artist of the Year will be announced at Nina's 13th birthday bash in mid-February. Plans for next year's exhibition are already underway.




Nina Board Chair, Shelagh Kubish welcomed guests to *Here's Nina* and was excited to see so many new donors join the patron program.
