City Approves Break on Loan Council approved \$300,000 loan reduction for facility

Edmonton City Council provided a huge boost to the Nina Haggerty Centre's fundraising efforts in May, approving a request for a reduction in outstanding loan balance for the Nina facility. Council approved a \$300,000 reduction, effectively removing the next lump sum payment that would have been due early in 2017.

The Centre is currently negotiating an amendment to its loan agreement with City administration. The new agreement will allow the Centre to make slightly larger annual payments for an extended term, with one last balloon payment due in the final year. This

allows the Centre to maintain operations, lifting the stress of having to raise capital funds at the same time it struggles to generate operating dollars.



Artists from the Collective gathered in the Marian Allen Kitchen Gallery in November 2013 to celebrate receipt of large donations from an anonymous donor and Eldon and Anne Foote Fund. These generous gifts helped the Nina achieve its goal to raise \$500,000 in just over one year, \$250,000 coming from the Stollery Charitable Foundation as a matching grant.

RBC Emerging Artist Project Begins

Nina welcomes 5 artists to new RBC apprenticeship program

The Nina Haggerty Centre was excited to launch the much anticipated RBC Emerging Artist Apprenticeship project on May 8. Five artists were selected from the many applications received in response to the Nina's call for artists looking for an opportunity to bridge the transition from academic art studies to professional artist career.

The artist apprentices will each work in the busy Nina studios one day a week alongside the professional artistic staff for the next 14 weeks. They will take on a specific project, working one-to-one with an artist from the Nina Collective or finding new avenues for exhibition.

The Nina will provide three workshops during the project with panels of experts from the local arts community to help artists learn some of the practical skills needed to promote their artist careers. Topics include preparation of CV's, Artist statements, grant applications, submissions for exhibition and press releases, along with gaining an understanding of how to present and install their work. The projects end in August with an exhibition of their own new work.
